4. Coalition Operational Updates (Stefanie Hendrickson)

- a. PiT Count results

- b. Strategic Planning update
 - i. Resilience Planning is undertaking a strategic planning process with the Coalition
 - 1. Currently reviewing background material
 - 2. Next step will be interviews with some community partners



- 3. We are also considering how to engage others to provide feedback
- c. System Inventory update
 - i. Jen Banks-Doll hired to complete step 1 of a System Inventory
 - 1. Fact-finding phase to assess resources, capacity, current coordination (ex. Coordinated Access, databases HIFIS, referral processes, etc...)
 - Peer engagement and agency engagement will also inform what current journeys and challenges look like for people who are navigating the "system"
 - 3. Jen will present findings at the December Coalition meeting.
 - ii. Our intention is that this is just the beginning of further work to support system coordination
 - Reducing homelessness requires efforts from the federal, provincial, and municipal governments, as well as by community members and community-based agencies. System coordination at the local level is considered one of the most promising practices as to what communities can do at a local level to better support folks experiencing homelessness
- d. School presentations request for support
 - Coalition is regularly asked to speak to school classes/groups about homelessness
 - 1. Generally we speak about anti-stigma, myth-busting, causes of homelessness, solutions, harm-reduction, data, etc... to date this has been Kaitlyn Nohr, Shawn Decaire, and Stefanie Hendrickson
 - Capacity is often limited with the three of us and it would be great if we had more people willing to do this work so that we can share the responsibility of teaching young people about homelessness.
