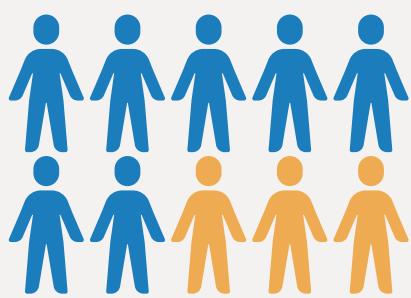
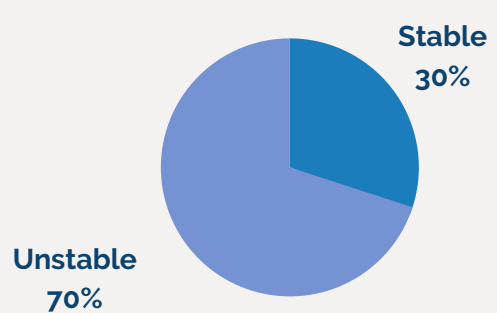

Highlighting Housing Unstable Respondents

Housing Stability

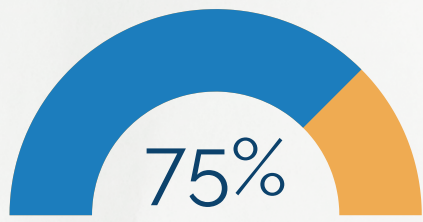
Out of the 110 survey submissions, 33 respondents were found to be housing stable, and 77 were found to be housing unstable.



Gender Identity

Of those who are housing unstable, 65% identified as women, 23% as men and 6% as non-binary.

Results show that 69% identified as heterosexual and, 9% identified as bisexual, & 7% as asexual, gay, and queer.



Employment Status

75% of housing unstable respondents are employed.

Employment Type

Of that, 32% are full-time, 39% are part-time, and 10% are casual.

Top Reasons for Housing Insecurity

- I don't make enough money
- I can't afford rent/mortgage payments
- My house needs major repair
- Conflict with landlord/family/spouse
- Illness/medical condition

Top Missing Amenities

- Air conditioning
- Home/property insurance
- Indoor plumbing/bathing facilities
- Sufficient & affordable heating
- Access to laundry facilities

Rent vs. Own

Of those who are housing unstable, 14 respondents own their home and 43 rent.

Shelter Use

75% of respondents did not require shelter services. However, 13% indicated that none were in their area, and others had concerns such as separation from pets.
